

## **Sports Premium Money – Rothwell Junior School – 2015/16**

### **What is the PE and Sports Premium Money for Primary Schools?**

The government is providing additional funding of £450 million over 3 years, 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016, to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in Primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. The funding should not be used to employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements or to teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming.

### **Sports Premium Money 2015/16**

The school received £5749.00 in November 2015 and a further £4106.00 in May 2016 from the Government's Sports Premium Money fund. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year the school has received money from the Sports Premium Grant.

At Rothwell Junior School, we have been spending the money as set out by the guidance from the Government. Our main aims are to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sports we offer to all of our students.

### **Vicky Gallagher - £3640.00**

We have spent £3640.00 on retaining a qualified coach to work with and support teachers in PE lessons. Vicky Gallagher is now in her second year working at Rothwell Junior School. She is employed by the Montsaye Academy Trust and is shared between other schools in our cluster including Rothwell Infant School, Desborough Havelock Infants and Juniors, Desborough Loatlands Primary and Wilbarston Primary school. Her main aims are to work 1:1 with teachers over a number of weeks, building the teachers confidence in delivering high standard PE lessons. Vicky starts of by modelling lessons and activities during PE lessons. Over a number of sessions, she allows the class teacher to take a lead of the lessons while giving advice, feedback and praising good practise. This academic year, she has worked with 2 Newly Qualified Teachers plus a number of Year 3, 4 and 5 class teachers. In the past, teachers have found working with Vicky very helpful in building their confidence in teaching this subject. They are able to organise activities better and now know how to assess children in this subject.

Vicky Gallagher supports Rothwell Junior School by organising and running clubs, competitions and festivals against schools within our cluster. The school have taken part in Athletics, Tri-Golf, Archery, Multiskills, Gymnastics and Dodgeball events. Spending the £3640.00 in this area has introduced new sports and activities to our students and encouraged more pupils to take up sports.

Vicky has also been working with children from year 5 by helping them become confident sports leader. It is planned that these year 5 children will be able to organise and help run lunchtime and after school clubs and festivals in the future.

#### Kettering School Sports Partnership - £1500

The school has paid £1500 from the Sports Premium Fund to Southfields Secondary School (Kettering School Sports Partnership) to ensure our pupils can take part in the Sainsbury's School games. This is where our pupils work individually or as a team and compete against other Primary Schools in the Kettering area. This academic year, we have competed in the K.S.S.P. Year 5/6 7-a-side football league for boys and girls. Both teams came second in their respected league and progressed to the level 3 County finals where they played against the best teams from Primary Schools within Northamptonshire. The Year 5 boys Futsal team were Champions at the K.S.S.P level 2 games and remained undefeated during the competition. They represented Northamptonshire at the regional finals.

Other K.S.S.P events the school has taken part in include; tag rugby, cross country, athletics and swimming.

#### Supply Cover - £396

£396 of this year's sports premium money has been used to release the PE co-ordinator from the classroom. During this release time, the PE co-ordinator has attended the MCLP PE committee meeting which includes the PE co-ordinators from schools within the Montsaye Academy Trust. During these meetings, good practise is shared, CPD events are organised, sports festivals and competitions are arranged and schemes of work are discussed and explored. The MCLP PE committee have been formed just over 3 years and a lot of hard work has come from this group to ensure all pupils have the opportunity to participate in high quality sports and activities.

#### PE and School Sports Conference - £150

In October, the PE Co-ordinator attended the PE and School Sports Conference ran by Northamptonshire Sport. This conference included guest speakers including Baroness Sue Campbell (Chair of Youth Sport Trust), Michael Crichton (Chair of afPE), Dr Lorraine Cale (Loughborough University), John Driscoll (Sports Coach UK) and John Mitcheson (HMI Lead for PE). The conference covered the latest national policies, with workshops offering practical solutions to support the delivery of PE, school sport & healthy activities.

#### Cambridgeshire Scheme of work for PE – £190

Rothwell Junior School have partnered up with schools within the MCLP PE committee to order a new PE scheme of work to compliment the Real PE scheme of work which was brought into the school 2 years ago. The Cambridgeshire Scheme of work is brand new and includes a number of resources to aid staff in the delivery of high quality PE lessons. The

scheme covers topics left out by the Real PE scheme including dance, games, athletics and gymnastics. The scheme includes a number of lesson plans, teaching points and interactive CDs.

#### Shin pads - £34.00

The school ordered 8 pairs of child shin pads for the girls and boys year 5/6 football team to use at the KSSP games. It is a legal requirement that children wear shin pads during the games. The school bought this equipment to make sure children were not excluded from participating in events due to not having the correct sporting equipment.

#### New Football kit - £300

With a number of 'A' teams and 'B' teams competing in a range of football events, the school needed to replace the old blue and black football kit. Some shirts had gone missing while other shirts, socks and shorts had become worn and damaged. The school used £300 to buy a new team strip from KarlsSports in Kettering. The kit will be used at the beginning of the 2016 academic year for boys and girls in all the year groups.

#### Looking into the future:

With £3835.00 of the Sports Premium Money still unspent this academic year, the school will be looking at using some of this money to:

- Continue releasing the PE Co-ordinator to attend the MCLP PE committee meetings.
- Buy in sports clothing for members of staff to wear on PE days to help raise the profile of PE within the school and highlight the importance of wearing suitable clothing while taking part in physical activity.
- Help the school gain a bronze, silver or gold School Games Mark Award. The School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme launched in 2012 which rewards schools for their commitment to the development of sports and competition across the school and into the community.
- Create a School Games event which allows all pupils to take part in a range of inclusive activities and celebrate sporting success.
